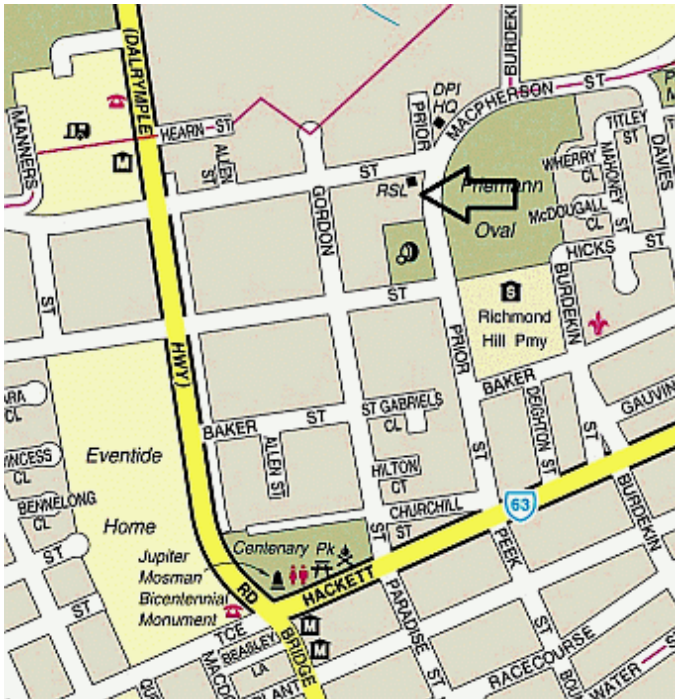

HISTORY

Aims and objects :

(parts taken from an original document by Peter Renton/VKPV, February 1979)

The fundamental aim of the North Queensland Amateur Radio Convention is to provide an opportunity for Radio Amateurs, Radio Club Members and those parts of the general community who have an interest in communications operations and technology to meet together socially every two years.

(It should be noted that Amateur Radio normally provides voice or data contact only, and many Amateurs never get to see the owner of the voice at the other end, even though they may have had years of regular contacts.)

Other subsidiary aims are as follows :

1. To provide a technical service in the form of lectures, visits, trade displays, films, etc.
2. To stimulate interest in various forms of technical activity by the running of contests. This could include homebrew construction (both technical and non-technical), amateur radio direction finding, construction sprints, operational proficiency etc.
3. To provide alternate activities and entertainment for spouses and families who may not be oriented towards Amateur Radio.
4. To provide a point of contact with all members of the general community whose interest lies in the techniques of communications, rather than in communication as an end to itself.
 Through the point of contact demonstration can be made of the advantages of Amateur Radio. Such other groups in the general community include people interested in Citizens Band Radio, Professional Mobile Radio, Maritime Communications, Outpost Radio, Disaster Communications, Experimental Communications and Space Communications.
5. To interest the general public in Amateur Radio and so encourage new participants to the hobby in due course.
6. To run the Convention in such a manner as to ensure that the running costs are met by convention registration fees and profits from sales of books etc.
 In alignment with the general scheme of non-pecuniary interests in the hobby, it is NOT the aim of the organisers to derive a large financial gain from the North Queensland Amateur Radio Convention.

History :

**THE KEN ROBERTSON VK4KT MEMORIAL AWARD
FOR OUTSTANDING ABILITY IN THE FIELD OF
AMATEUR RADIO EXPERIMENT**



This trophy is awarded at each NQ Amateur Radio Convention by Judy Robertson in memory of her late OM, Ken Robertson VK4KT, to an amateur radio licensee who is considered to have furthered experimentation and education in the field of radio technology.

Award Criteria :

The nominated person shall :

- be an active member of a local club
- be a member of the WIA and
- hold any recognised VK licence.

The area for selection of the nominee shall be "North Queensland", i.e. from Mackay north, and west, to also include the Central Highlands.

Main basis for selection shall be :

For Experimentation and Advancement of Amateur Radio.

For experimentation - involving practical radio and electronic construction techniques. Essential that practical results can and have been demonstrated.

For advancement - To communicate the results of such experimentation, mainly through demonstrations, talks, lectures, and published notes or articles.

Award Procedure.

- A call for nominations to be made by the Club sponsoring the NQ Convention, typically when other clubs are asked to supply club details.
- Each club can have one nominee only.
- Each nomination to include a précis of the reasons for nomination.
- Each club to appoint a delegate who will be at that NQ Convention, to meet with the other delegates and decide the recipient.
- The delegates may decide not to award the Trophy, if there are not any suitable qualified candidates.
- Recipient does not have to be at the North Queensland Amateur Radio Convention.
- The trophy to be normally retained by the host club of that NQ Convention until awarded again.
- A suitably framed certificate will also be awarded to the recipient for their personal display.
